

PechaKucha is a specific style of presentation that originated in Japan that entails presentations of 20 slides, displayed for 20 seconds each, for a total presentation time of 6 minutes and forty seconds.

It is simple, engaging, and more memorable!



1. Think about what you want to present- key parts of your research that you want to discuss, highlighting the “why, how, who” also, how the population was reached.
2. Choose images that will allow you to tell a story. For example, a picture of a Wade Oval Wednesday crowd or Visa Gift card to explain recruitment and retention. Also, graphs and tables are ok, but make sure they aren’t too complicated.
3. Take notes about what you will say for each slide. Be prepared and practice. Its cringy when presenters go over their allotted 20 seconds and the next slide comes up and they are still talking about the old one, eek!
4. Consider your audience and have fun!
